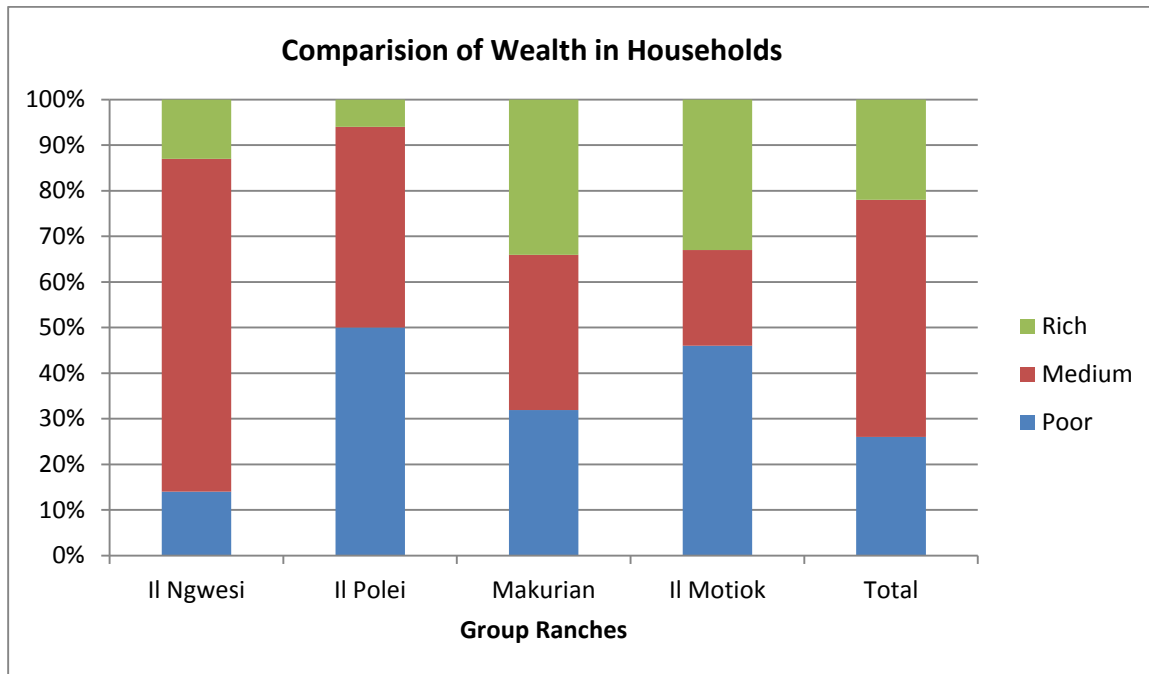

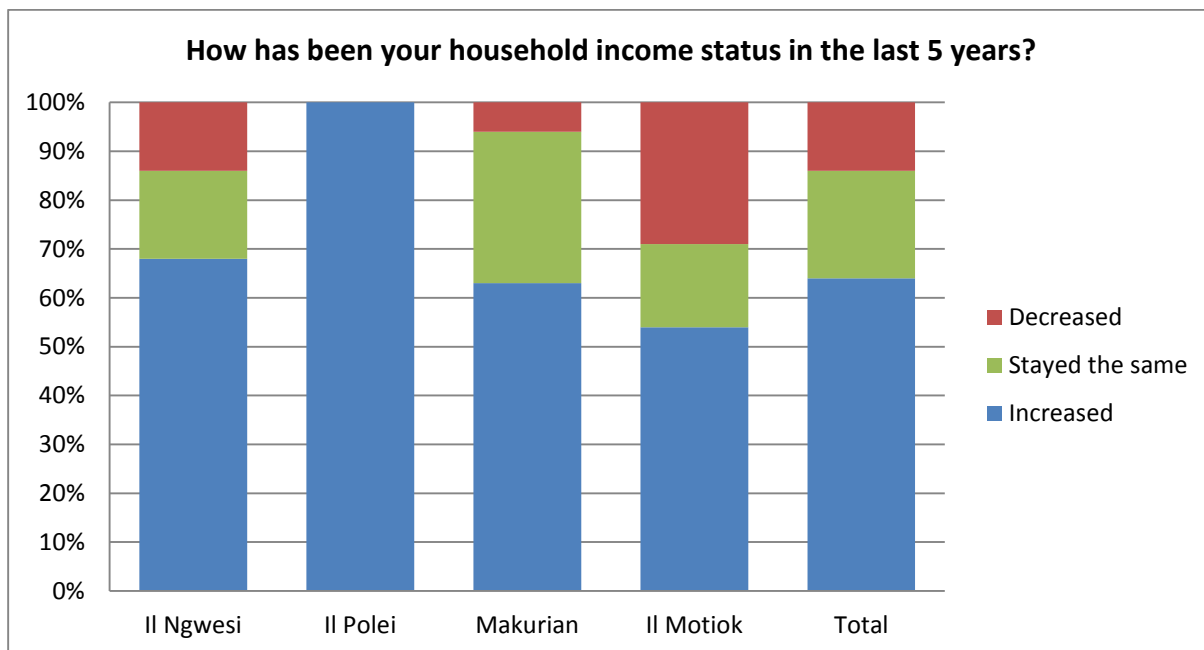

A total of 155 households participated in the survey. Two respondents per household (Household Head and Senior Wife) were interviewed, making a total of 310 participants in this survey.

Households Wealth Ranking

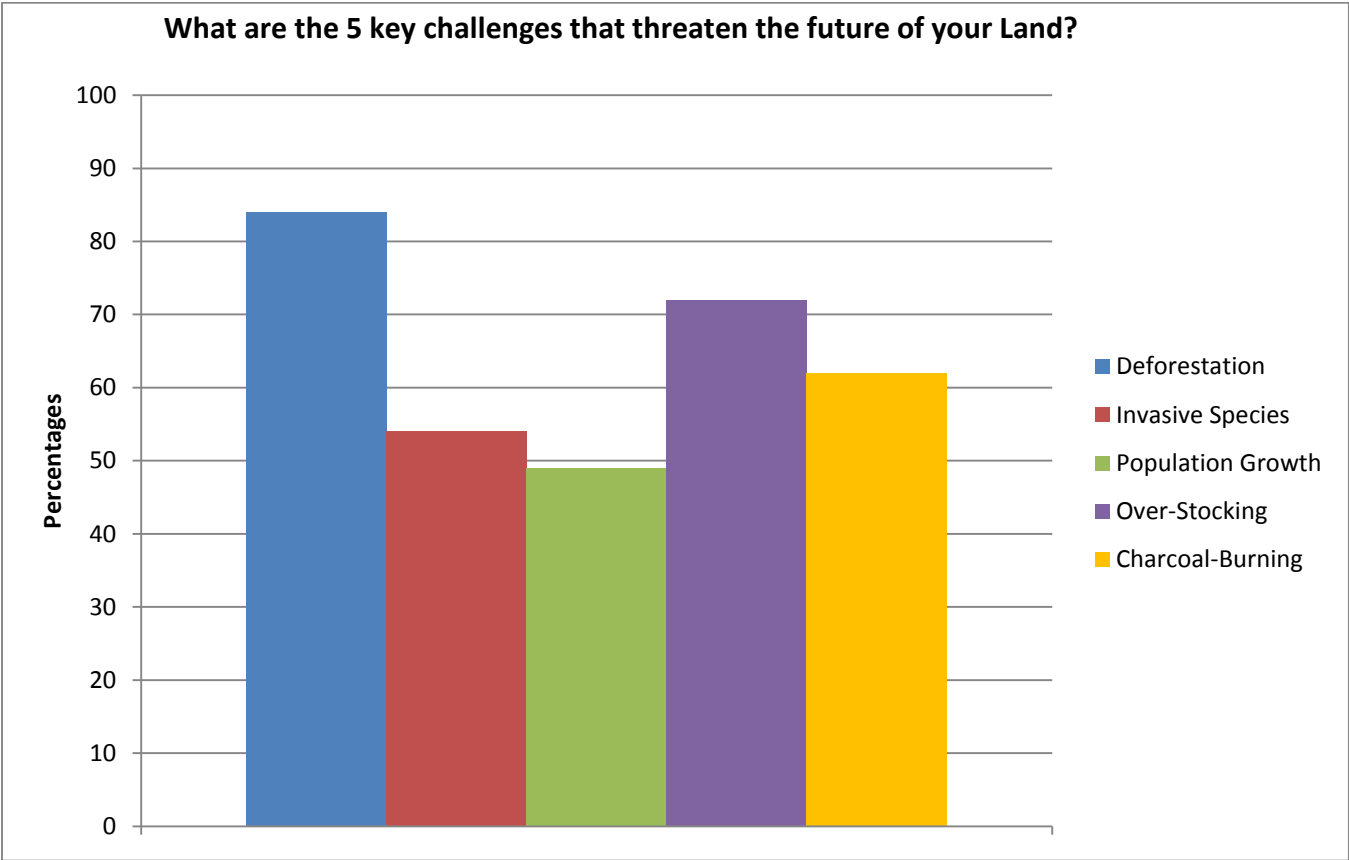


The figure above portrays the ranks as per households, majority of the respondents (52%) in this survey as per the **total sample** fall under medium category.

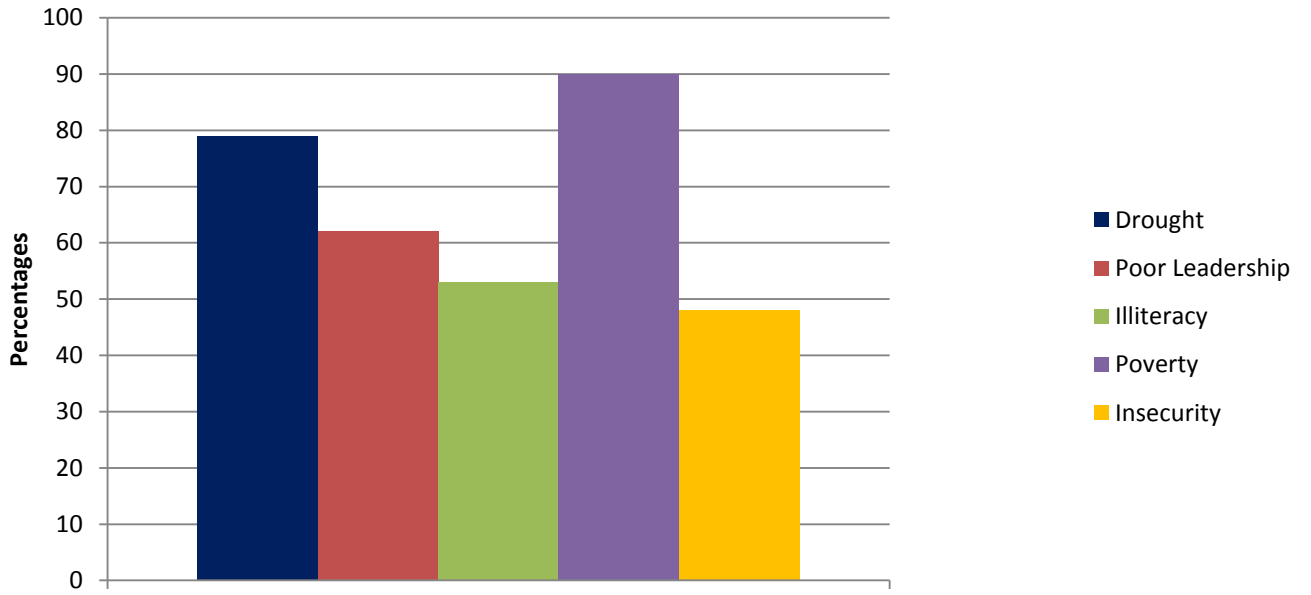


In the figure above, households were required to analyze their income status in the last 5 years, 100% of respondents from Il Polei noted an increase. For the total sample 64% noted increased income, 22% said the income status remained the same and 14% noted a decreased.

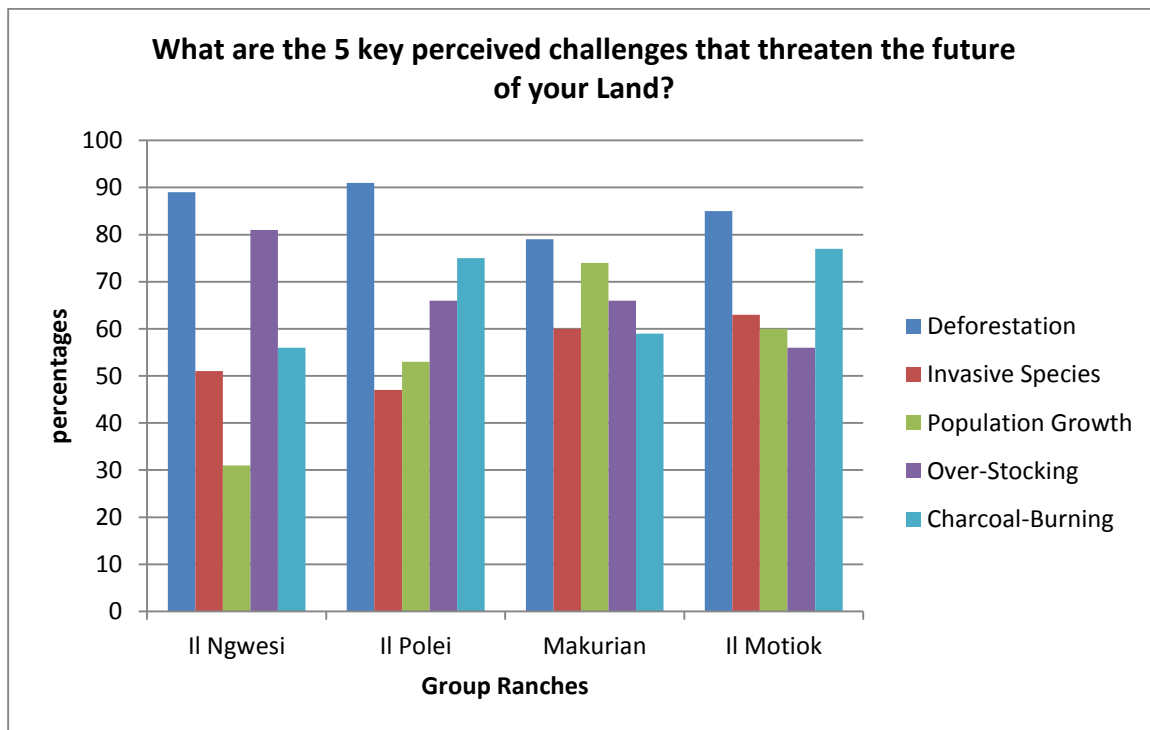
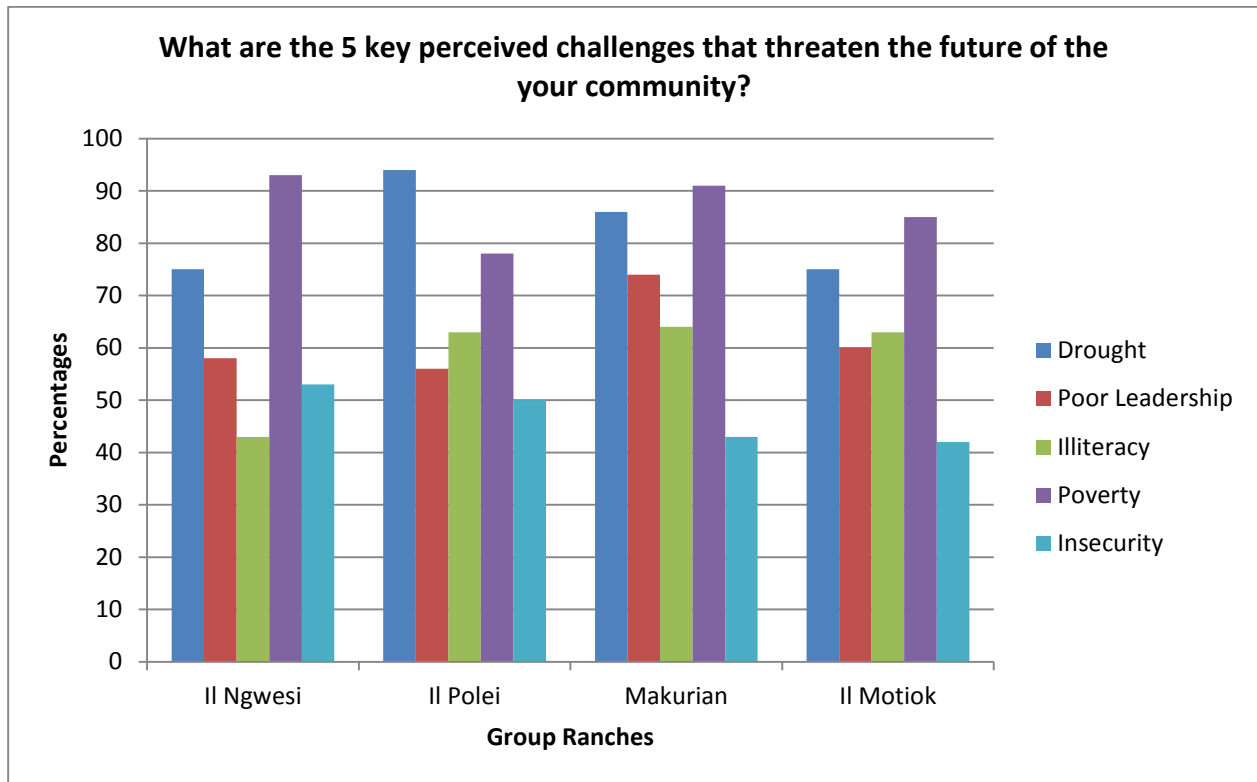

What are the 5 key challenges that threaten the future of your Community?

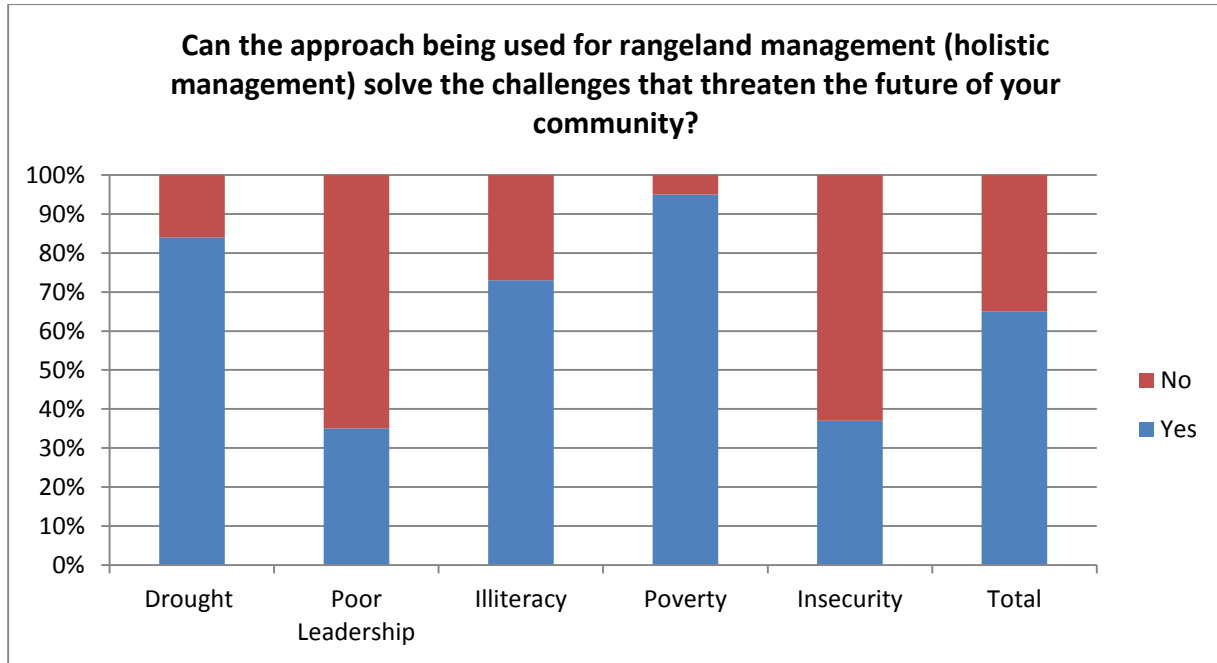


Perceived Challenges that threaten the future of Communities

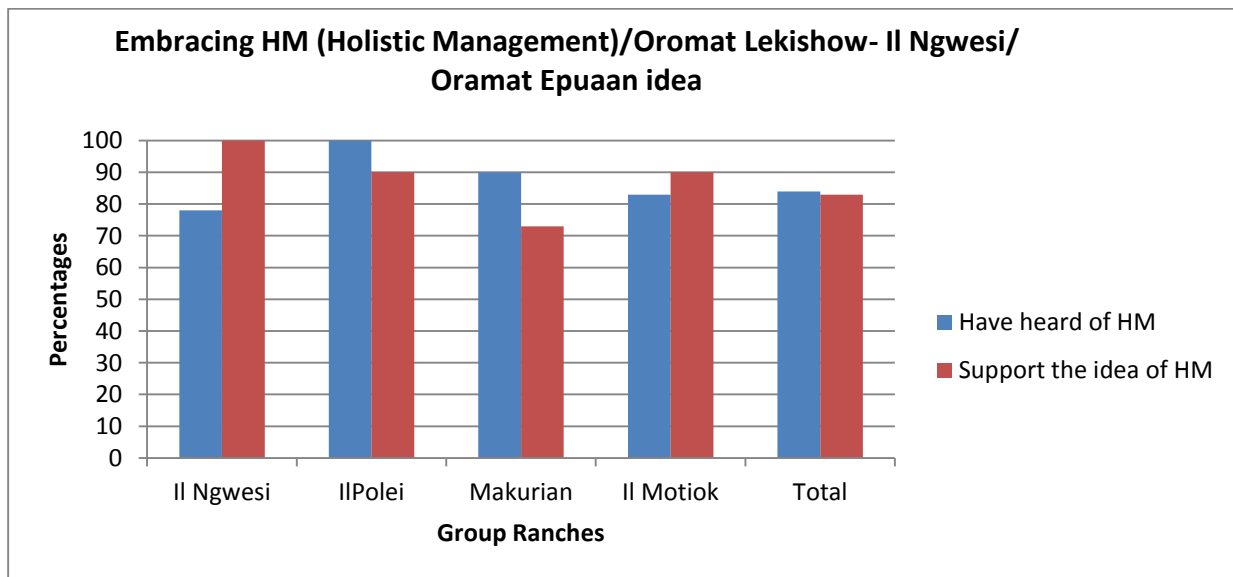

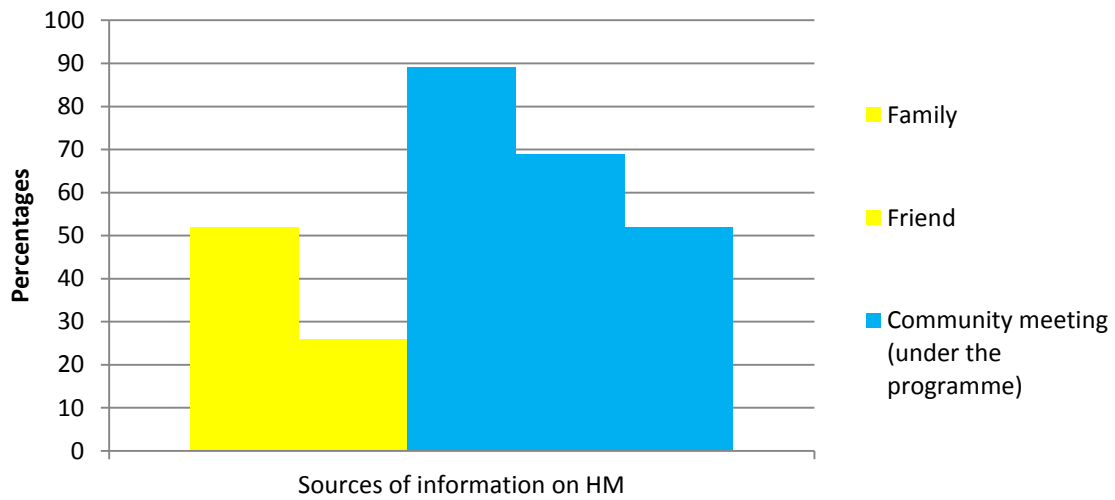
Can HM solve 5 key challenges that threaten the future of the community?



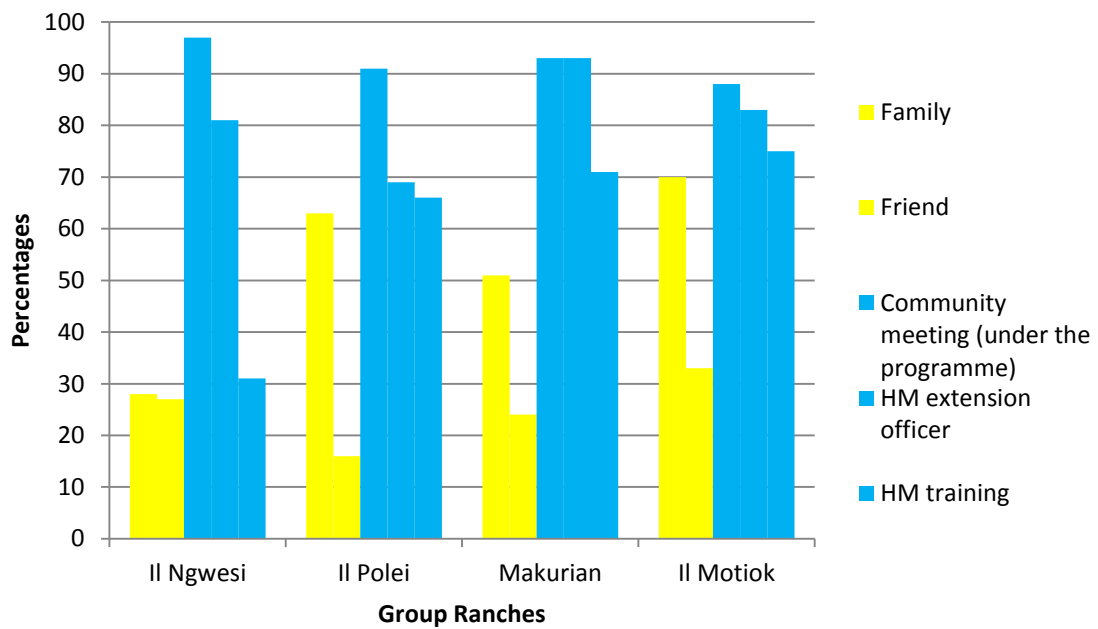
In the above figure, 65% of respondents feel that HM (Holistic Management) can solve the challenges that threaten the future of the community.

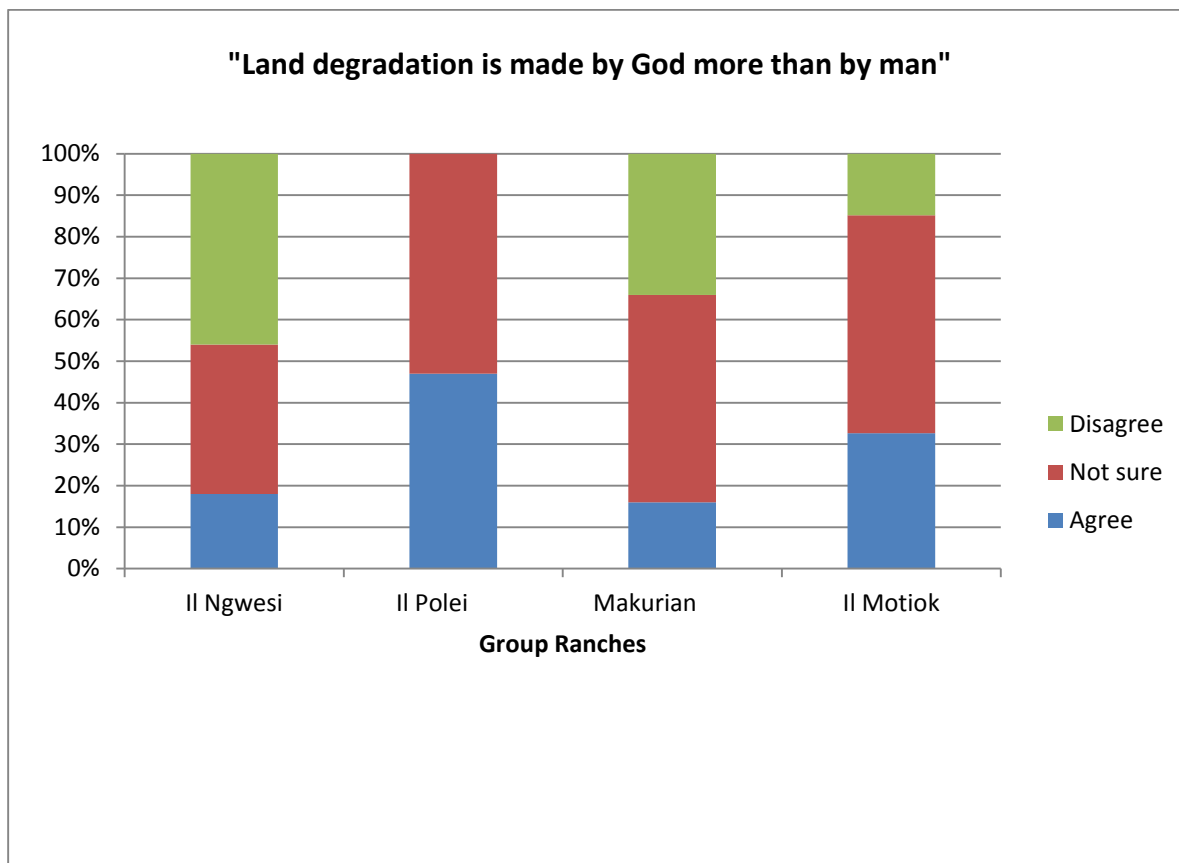
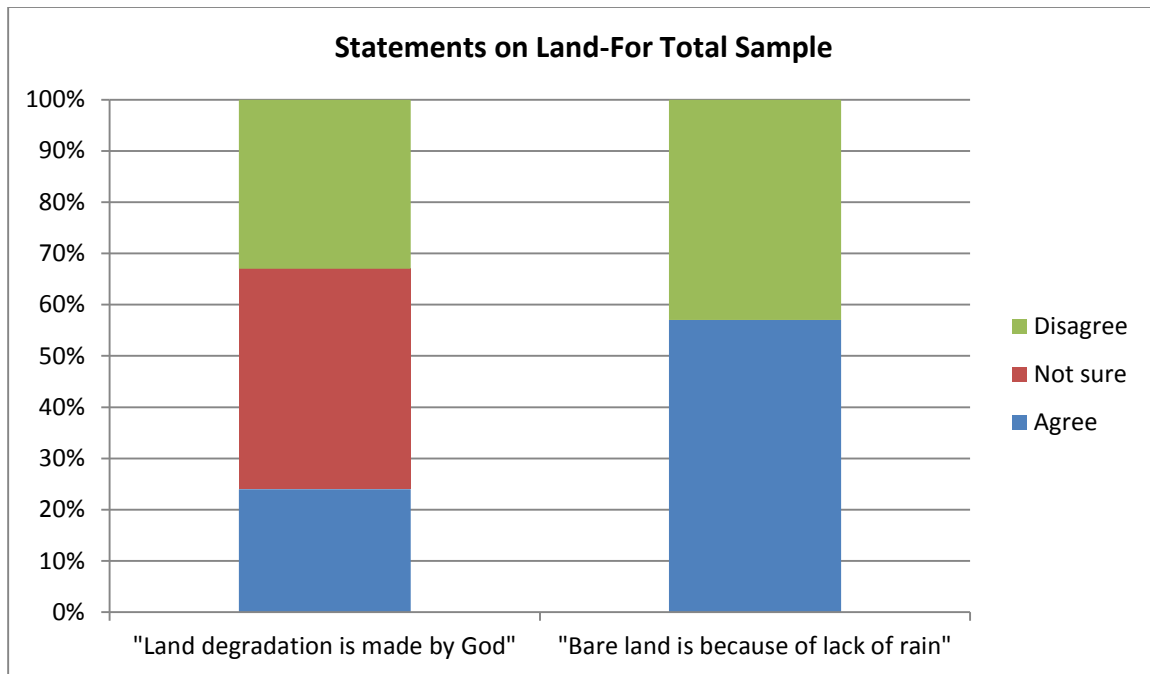


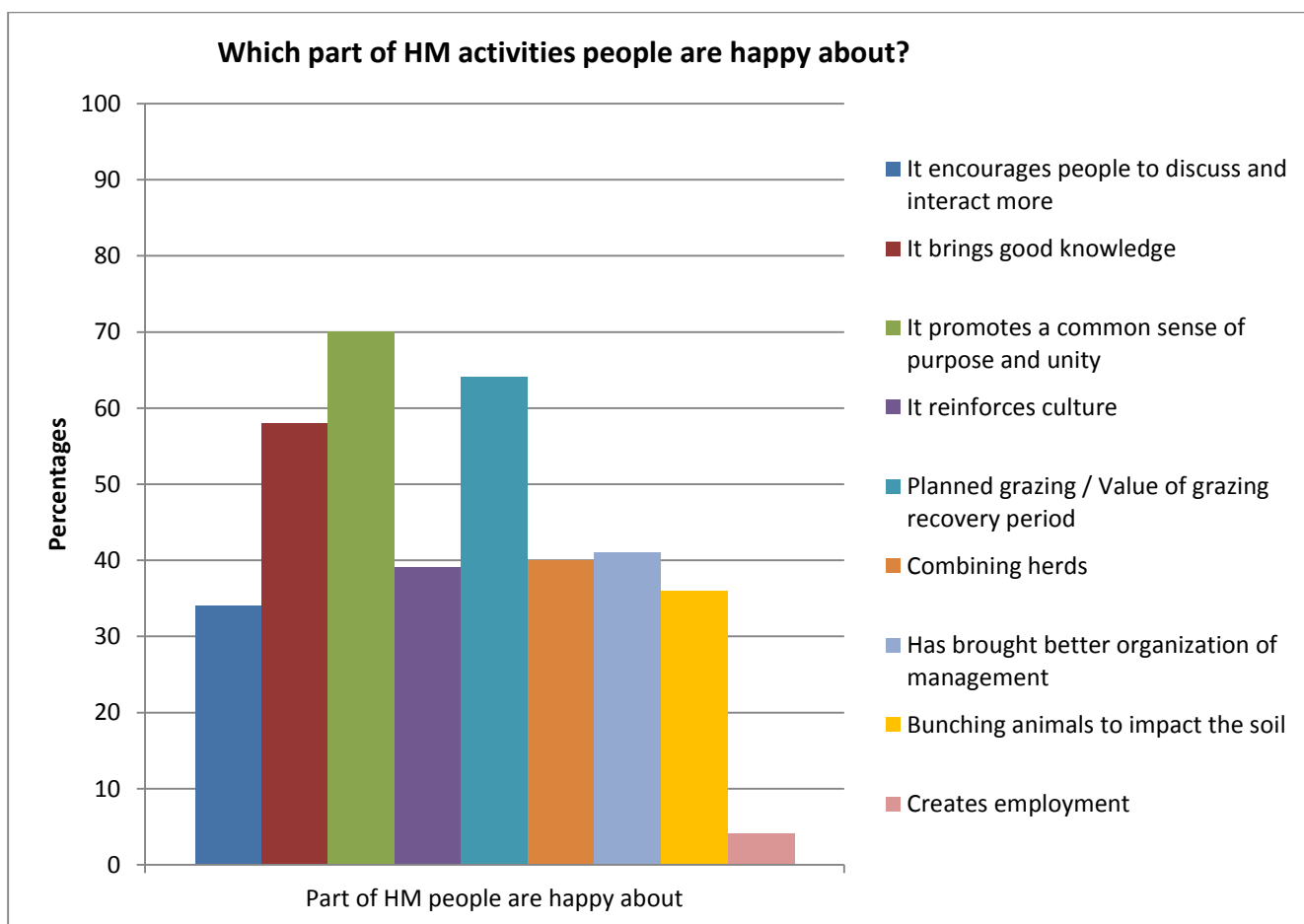
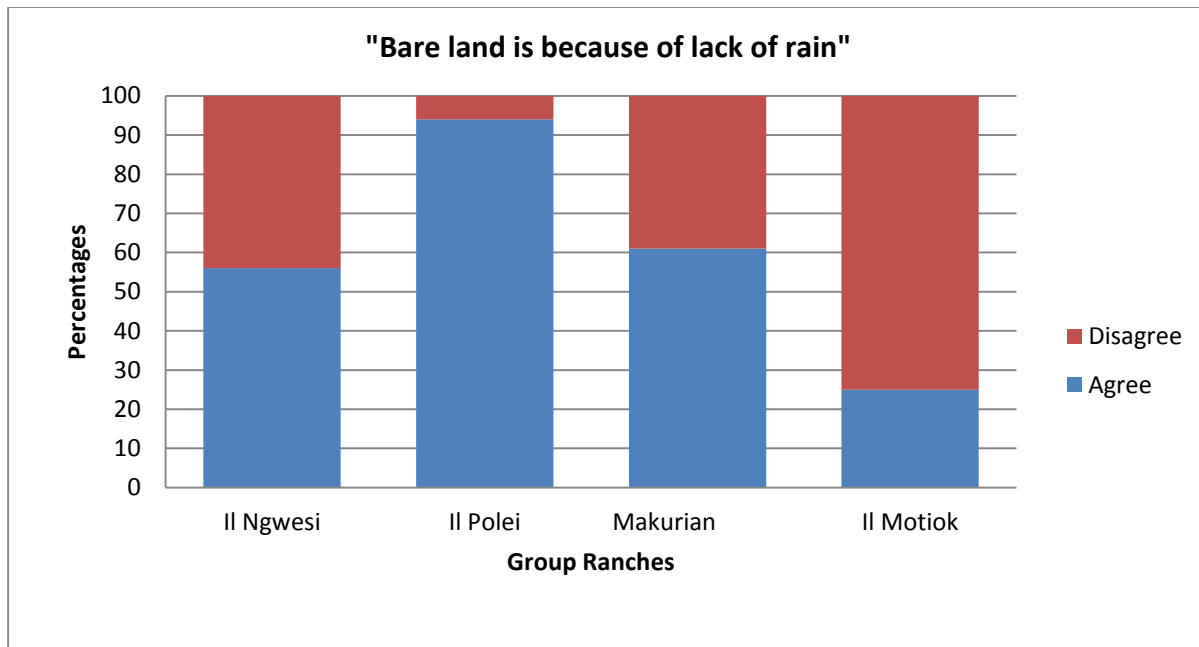
What was the source of HM information? - Total Sample

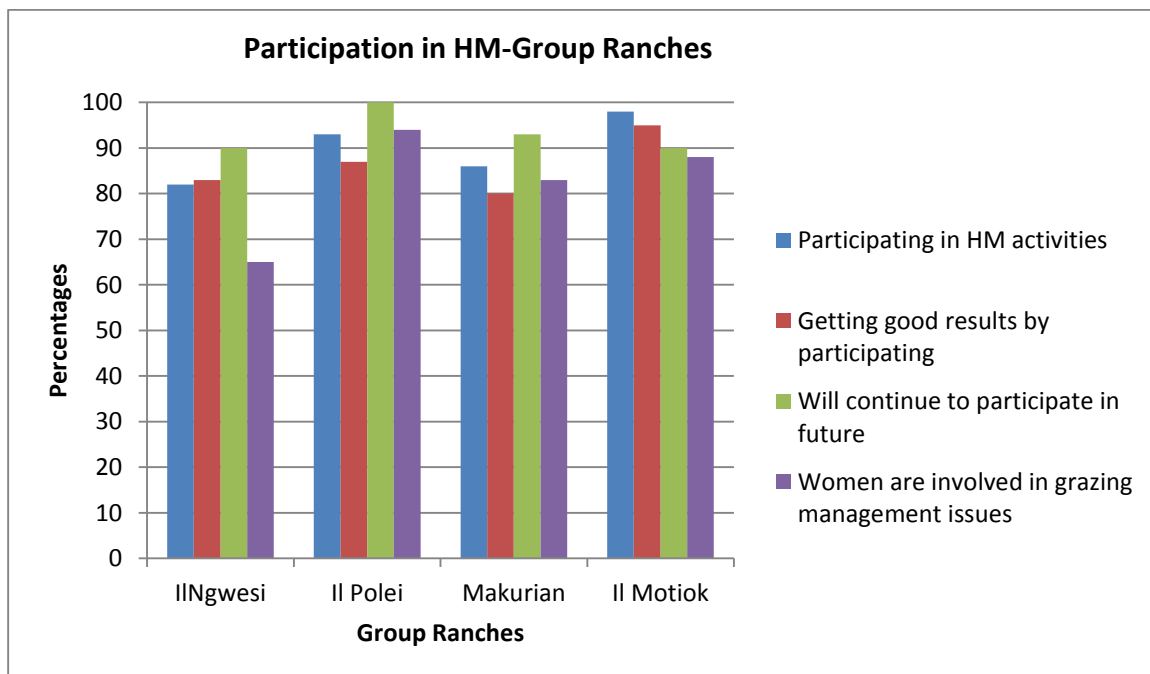
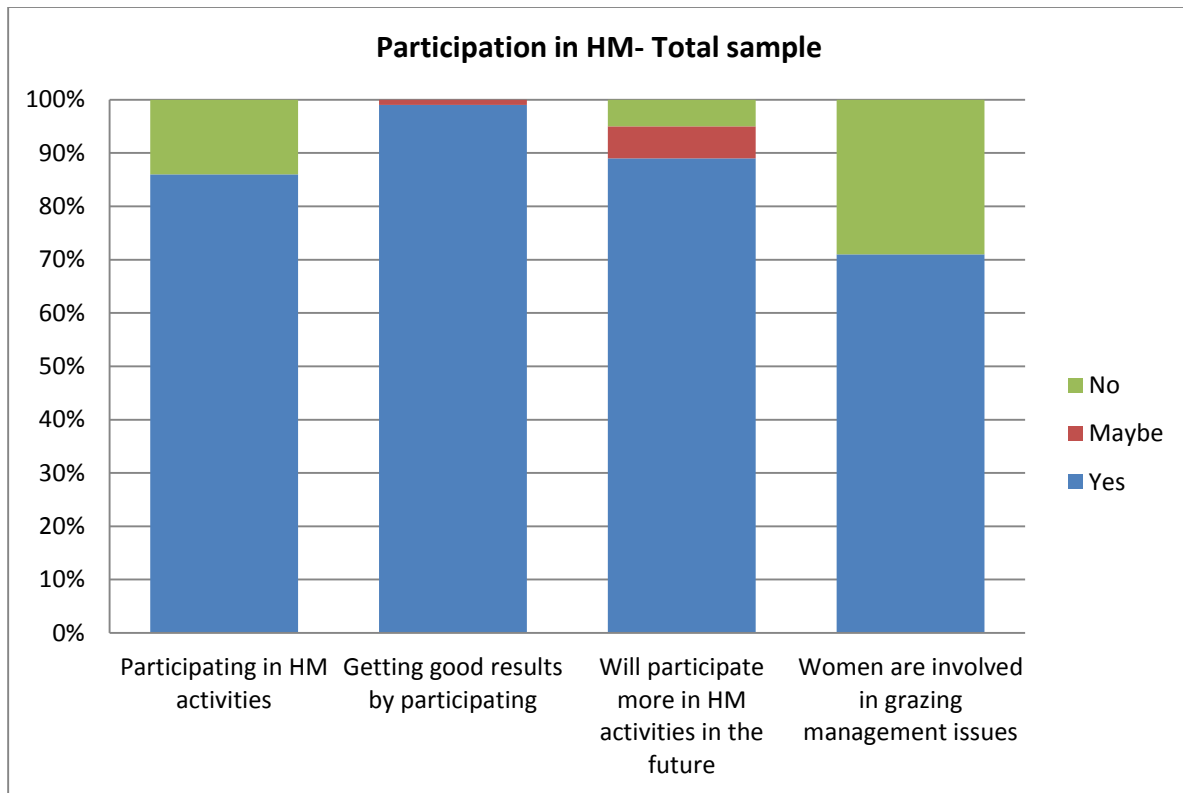


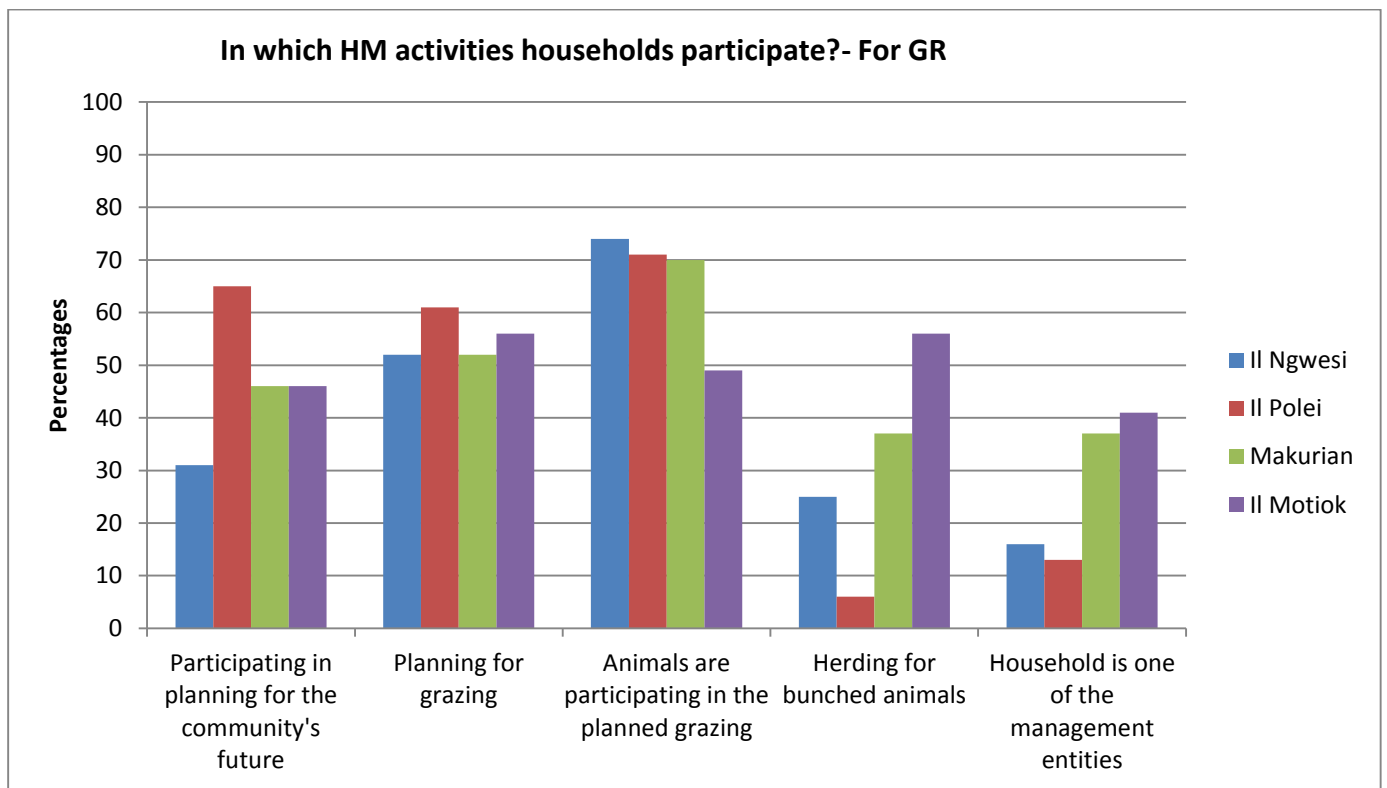
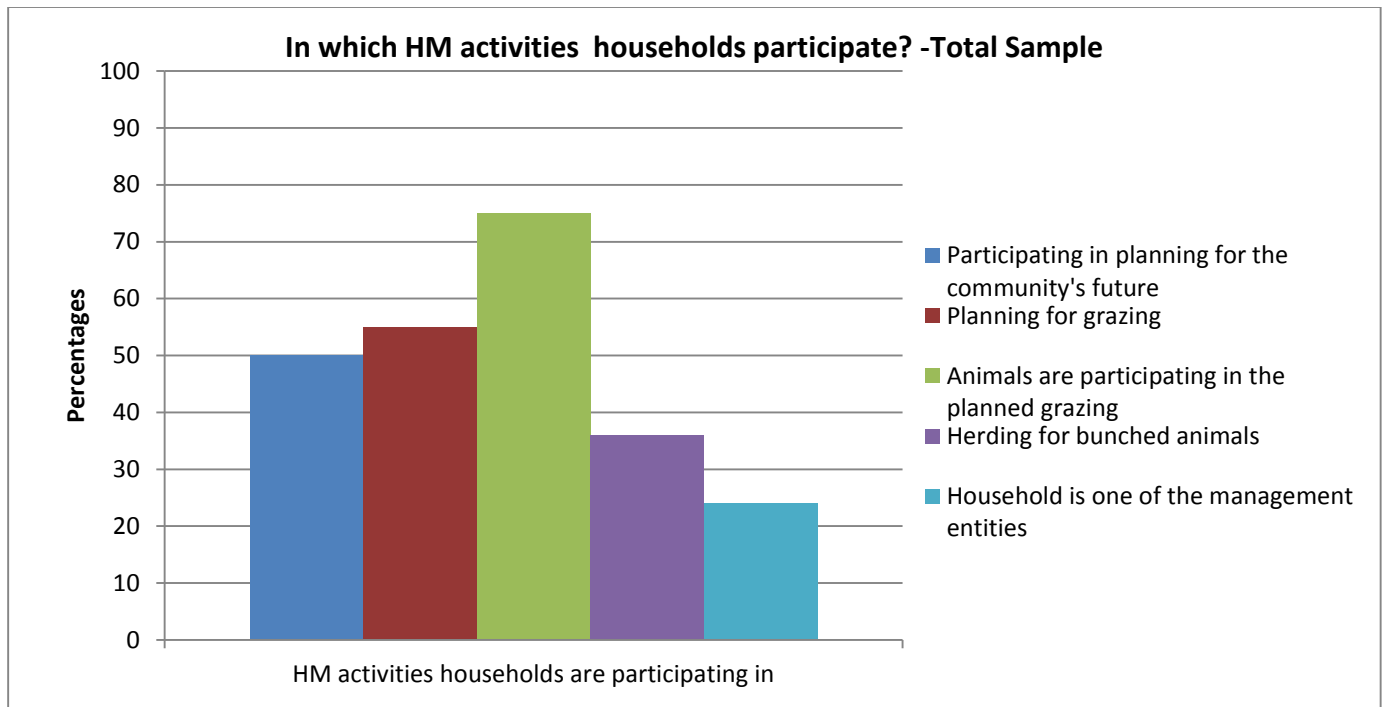
What was the sources of information on HM?- Group Ranches

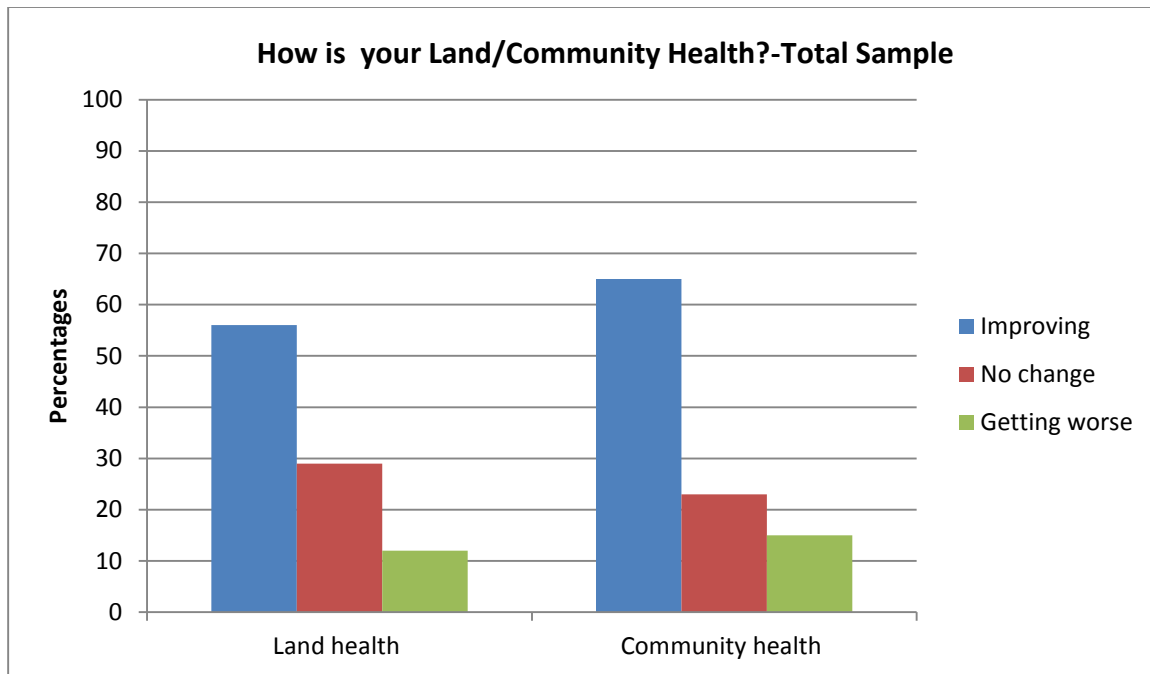




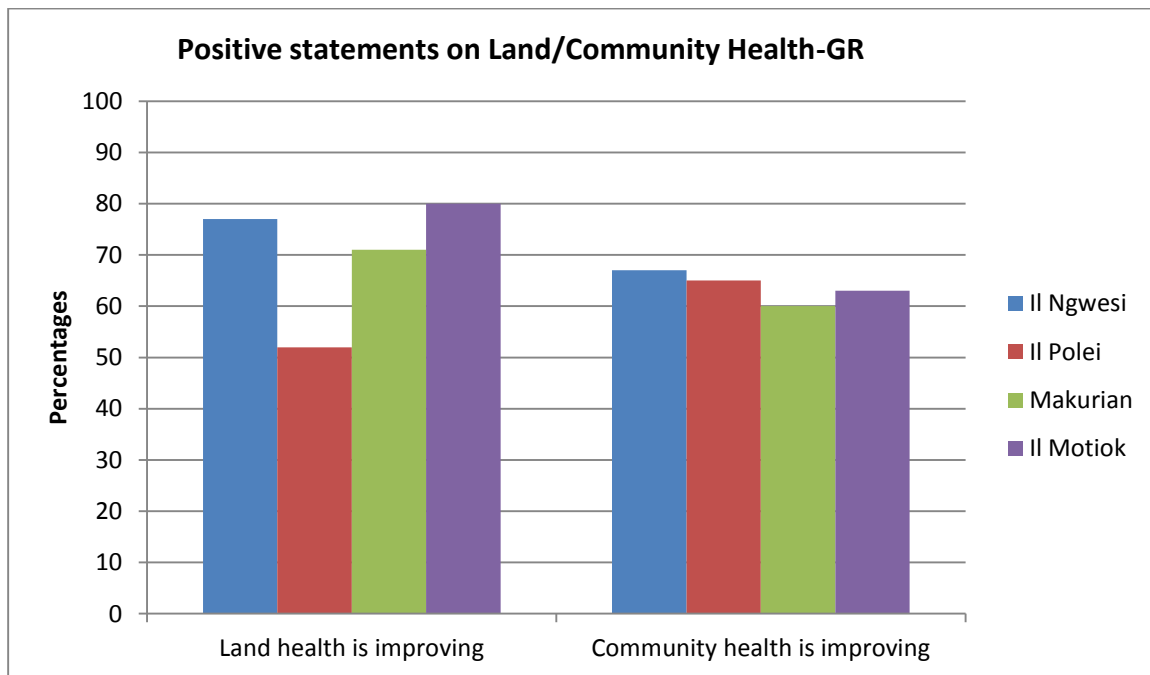




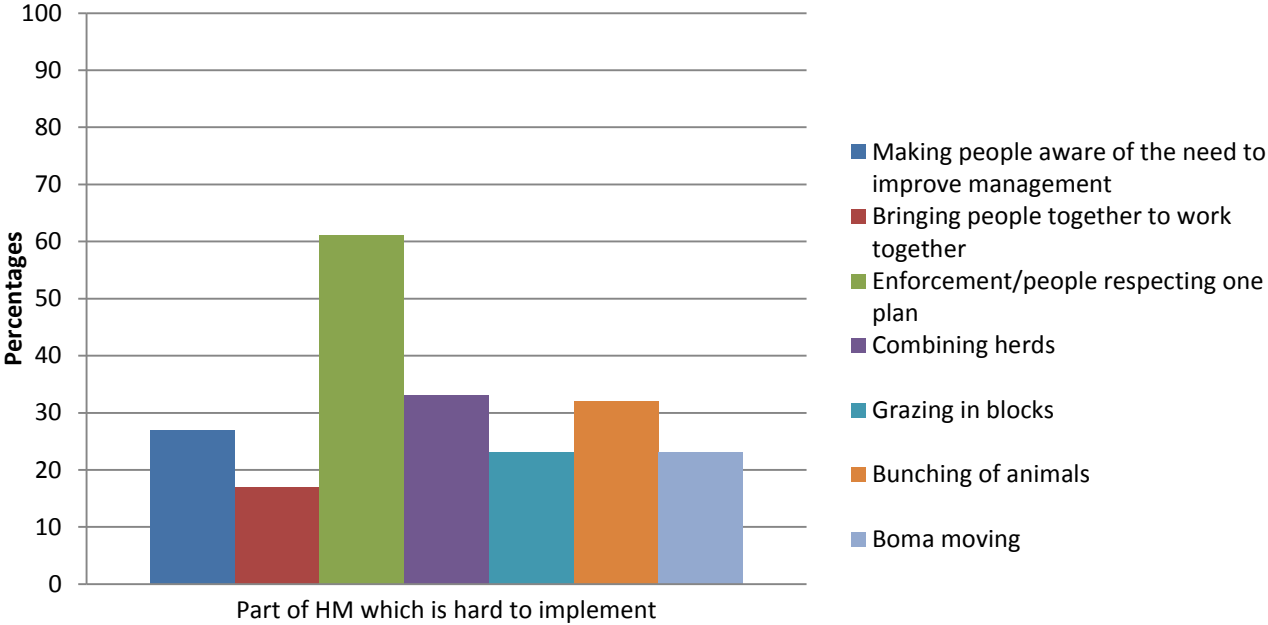




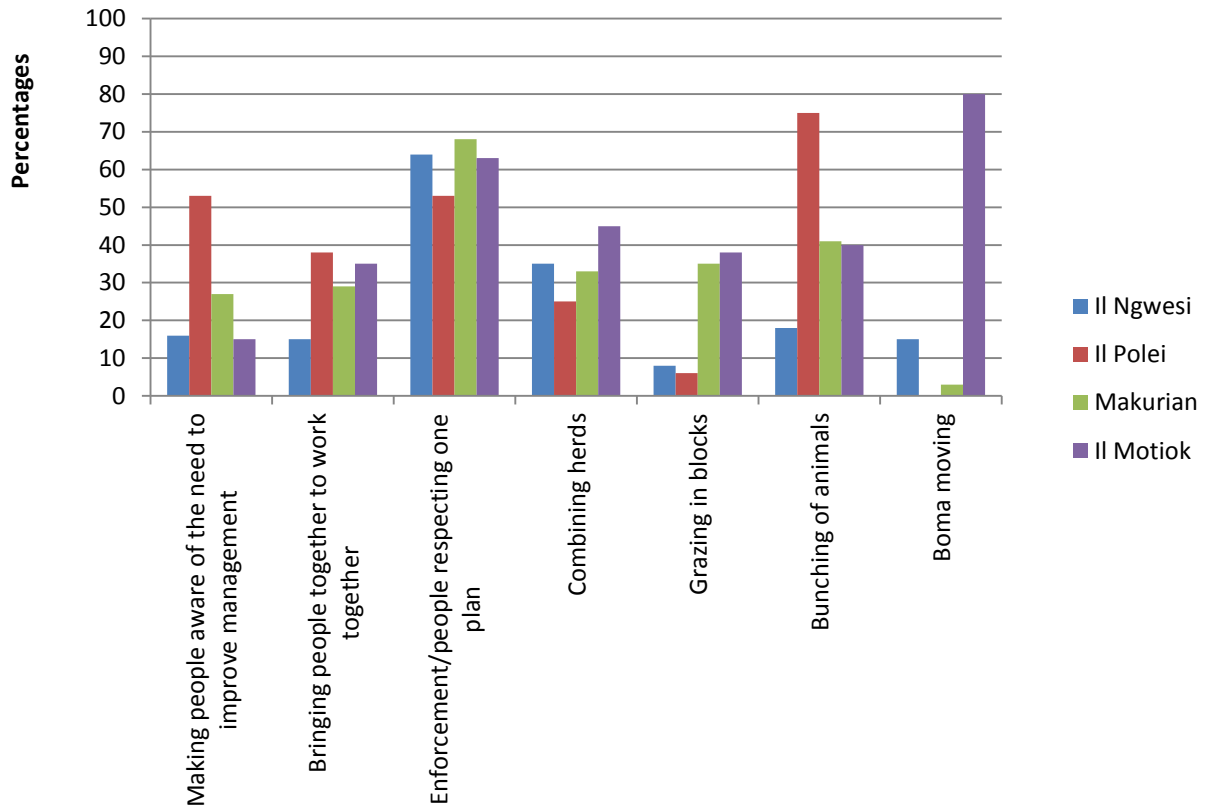
The above figure portrays results for total sample on land/community health. Majority of respondents (50% plus) confirmed improvement in both land and community health.



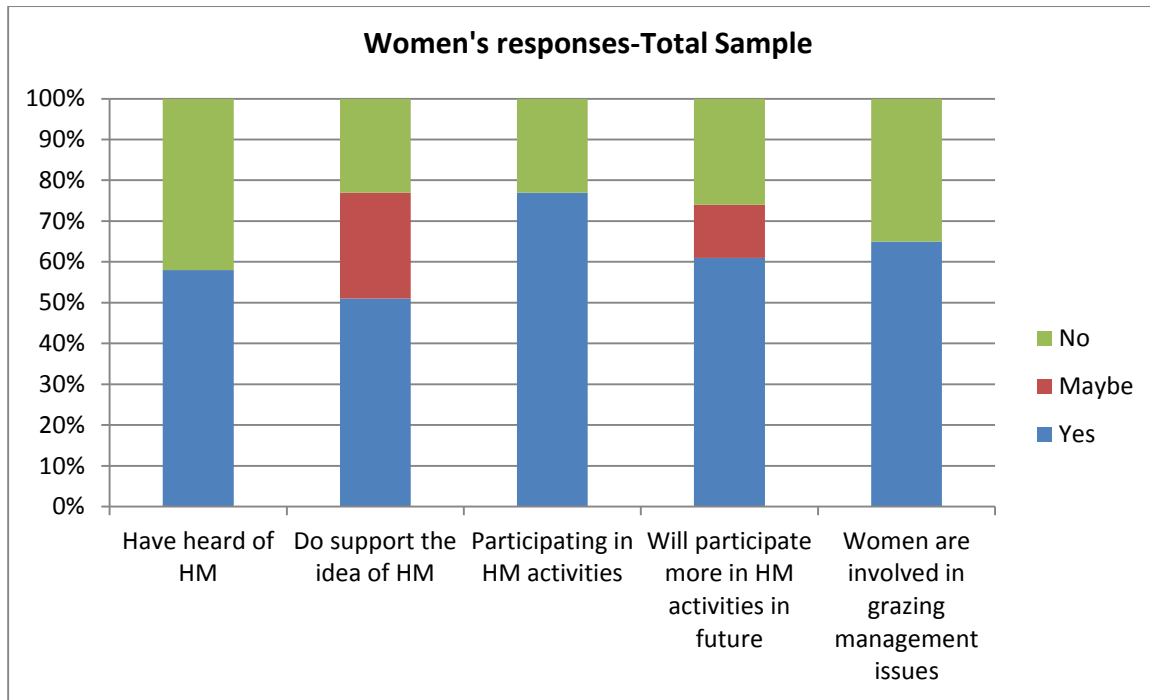
Which part of HM is hard to implement?



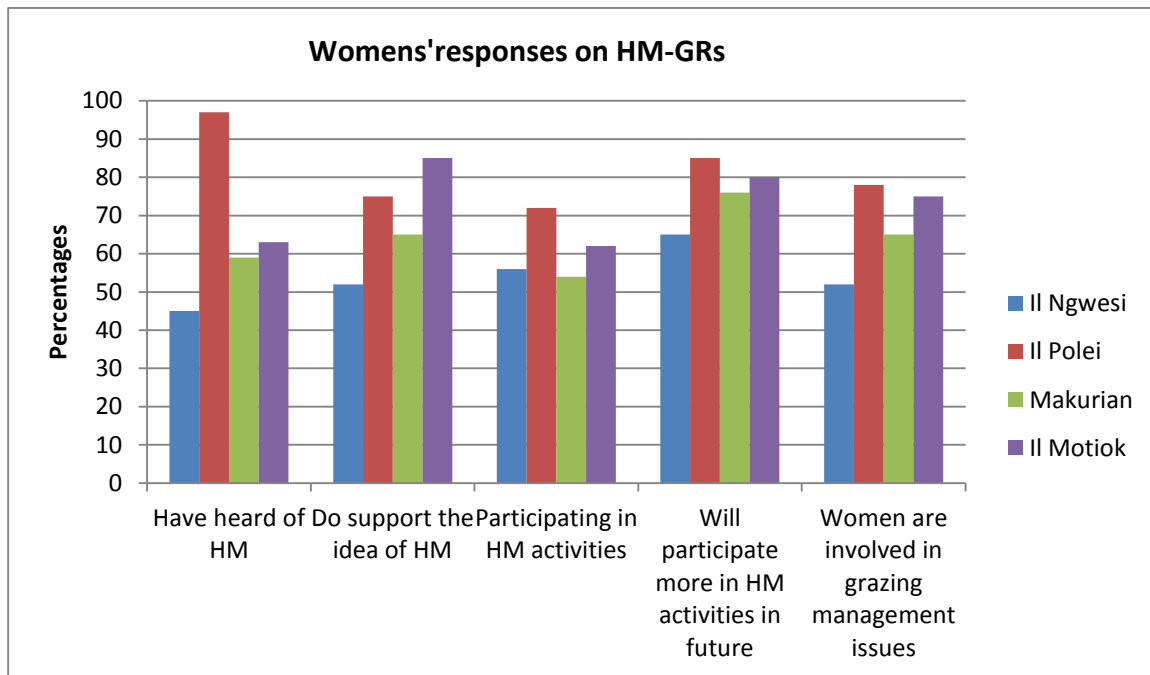
Part of HM which is hard to implement? -For GRs



Part B: Results-For Women



The figure above shows how women responded during the interviews. A total of 155 women were interviewed during the survey, from the total sample, 50% plus are positive about HM and its activities.



As shown in the figure above, women in Il Polei (70% plus) are more aware and involved in HM activities as compared to women in Il Ngwesi and Makurian group ranches.
